GRAND LODGE OF VIRGINIA ORDER SONS & DAUGHTERS OF ITALY IN AMERICA 38TH BIENNIAL CONVENTION – APRIL 28-29, 2023 CELEBRATION OF 100th ANNIVERSARY OF GLVA

The Grand Lodge of Virginia (GLVA) will hold its 38th Biennial Convention at the Roma Lodge, Virginia Beach, VA on the weekend of April 28-29, 2023. The convention will also be a celebration of Grand Lodge of Virginia's 100th Anniversary.

Italian Heritage Lodge is entitled to nine delegates, not including our President, Dawn Falsinotti, and Trustee, Marianne Hallahan, as she is currently an IHL member serving on the grand council of GLVA. At our February meeting, delegates will be nominated to attend the convention. Delegates must be regular members for at least one year and cannot be social members. Election of delegates will be held at our March meeting. Non-delegates are welcomed to attend and separate forms will be attached for those members. Non-delegates are not charged a registration fee but will be charged for meals.

Attached to the email with the February issue of *La Bandiera* were the corresponding forms for delegate and non-delegate registration, convention materials, meal selections, and T-shirt orders. The registration deadline is **March 31, 2023.** Your registration fee of \$140 includes a Thursday evening hospitality event, Friday evening dinner, Saturday morning and afternoon snacks and lunch, Saturday evening Banquet, convention materials, Program, 100th Anniversary Celebration Book, and gift bag. Holiday Inn: Virginia Beach – Norfolk is holding a block of rooms for GLVA. Information about room reservations will be sent out upon request. Ads can also be placed in the Convention program. LENT 2023 ~~ Order Sons and Daughters of Italy in America

Sisters and Brothers, The Lenten Season is upon us with its call to prayer, almsgiving and fasting. As you know this time is not simply one of fasting from chocolate, beer or other pleasures. It is about facing down our demons by fasting from our bad habits, negative attitudes, inappropriate behaviors or wrong choices, and feasting on the grace of God. Last year I offered a reflection on what we might wish to fast from, and in turn feast on during Lent. I have merged those "fast and feast" reflections for our use this year. Offered in homily form to our members who participated in our 2023 February Plenary Session Eucharist this past weekend, I offer it here for all our sisters and brothers.

Let's try to FAST from judging others, emphasizing differences, apparent darknesses and FEAST on Christ dwelling in others, the unity of life and the reality of light.

Let us FAST from thoughts of illness, from words that pollute, pessimism and FEAST on the healing power of God, phrases that purify and gratitude.

This Lent let us try to FAST from anger, pessimism, worry and FEAST on optimism, patience and providence. In these next few sacred weeks let us FAST from complaining, negative attitudes, unrelenting pressures and FEAST on appreciation, affirmation and unceasing prayer.

Let us FAST from hostility, bitterness, self-concern and FEAST on non-resistance, forgiveness and compassion for others.

Try to FAST from personal anxiety, discouragement, facts that depress and FEAST on eternal truth, hope and verities that uplift.

Let us FAST from lethargy, suspicion, thoughts that weaken and FEAST on enthusiasm, truth and promises that inspire. Lastly, during Lent let us try to FAST from sorrow, gossip, problems that overwhelm and FEAST on the sunlight of serenity, purposeful silence and prayer that sustains.

Festa dí San Gíuseppe 19 marzo



St Joseph's Day is celebrated on March 19 and always falls during Lent. According to legend, there was a drought and famine in Sicily many centuries ago. The villagers prayed to St. Joseph and asked his intercession before God. Their prayers were answered. With the ending of the dreadful famine, a special feast of thanksgiving was held in his honor. In many Italian homes, churches, and community centers, it is tradition to set a special table to San Giuseppe, to honor him and to provide food for the homeless and hungry. The doors of Italian homes were opened to family and friends as well and favorite foods were served, including sweets such as Zeppole and beautiful loaves of braided breads in the shape of a staff or a cross. Italians also served pasta with breadcrumbs – "Carpenter's Pasta" – to symbolize the sawdust from St. Joseph's workshop, and Fava beans, which survived the famine and saved the Sicilian people from starvation.

The heart of this tradition can be found in these three aspects:

Veneration—special recognition of St. Joseph at the "table".

The Table—both a kind of "altar of reverence", and a communal celebration.

The Poor—The intention of all the gifts is to help those in need.


