Dear Sisters and Brothers of our Order,

If we learned nothing else this exceptional year of 2020 with all its divisions, disorder and discomfort, it is that life is in constant flux and continually invites us to become more mindful and charitable. The Advent-Christmas Season is a time to practice this mindfulness as reflected in the following story.

On Christmas Day a small manger scene sat on a hallway table in a neatly kept home. People hurried past it all day. They barely noticed the tiny figures gathered around the infant tucked in the straw. In the morning, children raced by it on their way to the Christmas tree. At noon, arriving guests pushed past it to get to the dining room. One accidentally knocked over a shepherd as his sweater brushed by it.

Later in the afternoon, a well-fed group of adults and children moved somewhat slowly by the manger again as they drifted from the dining room back to the living room. None of them stopped to look at the manger. None of them even noticed it, except two.

An elderly woman, walking with a cane, paused in front of the scene. Gently she set the shepherd back in an upright position. Then she looked at the Christ child in the middle of all the figures. As she stood there, she became aware of her small grandson standing by her side. As voices bellowed from the living room the two continued to look at the manger scene. A smile spread across the woman's face as the child took her hand. In the midst of a day filled with so much distraction the two of them quietly received God's gift. It's a gift wrapped with the most exquisite paper imaginable, a bundle of swaddling clothes.

This gift of God has been offered to each of us by the One whose birthday we prepare for during Advent and celebrate throughout the Christmas Season. Sadly, however, not all who profess faith in Christ will unwrap and discover the hidden splendor and grace of God's love for us. Others, thankfully, will have mindfully and "quietly received God's gift", then share it with others in a spirit of charity.

Brothers and sisters, as members of our beloved Order we have responded to this call of charity for well over a century. Our eternal inheritance, however, hinges on more than just charity. Therefore, let us implore the Prince of Peace, living through us by the power of His Spirit, to become more mindful in fostering the reconciliation, justice and healing that our world and nation needs --- that God asks of us in every season of our lives.
