### IHL SPAGHETTI DINNER GUEST SPEAKER

Saturday, September 10, 2022


Our distinguished guest speaker for our annual Spaghetti Dinner will be Chad T. Sarchio who served as the 50<sup>th</sup> president of the D.C. Bar from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. He was the third Italian-American lawyer to serve in that post since the D.C. Bar was established in 1972, and only the second government lawyer to do so.

Chad grew up in New Jersey, about a half hour northeast of New York City. During elementary and high school, he was a member of the Boy Scouts and rose to the highest rank of Eagle Scout. After graduating from high school, he received a scholarship from the National Italian-American Foundation (NIAF) and entered the Public Policy Program at Duke University in North Carolina. He also received a U.S. Army Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) scholarship. After earning his undergraduate degree and receiving his commission as a second lieutenant, he went to law school at George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

After obtaining his law degree, he served on active duty in the Judge Advocate General (JAG) Corps for four years and stayed in the U.S. Army Reserves for 20 more years. His first assignment was at Fort Bragg, N.C., working in legal assistance and claims positions. Then, in the Fall of 1997, he began a six-month deployment to Bosnia and Herzegovina as a senior foreign claims commissioner. He completed his active service as military counsel to the Army's Auditor General. During his service, he married another lawyer, the former Christina Guerola, with whom he has two children.

After leaving active duty, he served as a federal prosecutor in the U.S. Attorney's Office in D.C. for more than six years, prosecuting a wide range of violent and white-collar crimes. In the Fall of 2005, he worked on a Senate Select Committee investigation into the response to Hurricane Katrina, which had hit the Gulf Coast. As a reservist, he later taught at the U.S. Army JAG Corps School. In the Spring of 2016, he became a military judge. He retired from the U.S. Army and its trial bench as a lieutenant colonel in 2019.

He has worked as an associate chief counsel for the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) since 2006, and has lectured in trial and appellate advocacy at George Washington University for more than 20 years. During his spare time, he repairs and maintains classic cars.

### Here is an update on Sharon Strauch's grandson, Hunter:

He is beginning to slowly walk again through the assistance of physical therapy which was necessary due to his weak ankles and stiff feet. While today *ferragosto* does refer specifically to August 15, the origins of *ferragosto* go back to Ancient Rome to the time of Rome's first emperor, Octavian Augustus, who ruled from around 27 BCE to his death in 14 CE. In 18 BCE, Augustus imposed the *feriae Augusti* (Latin for "Augustus' rest"). Augustus proclaimed the 1st of August a day of rest to recover from the long harvest season. Workers would wish their patrons well, and in return would receive a tip from them. This became so ingrained that during the Renaissance, it became law under the Papal States. The *feriae Augusti* were celebrated across the Roman Empire. There were widespread feasts, games, and horse races. Beasts of burden were given a day of rest as well, and even adorned with flowers. Since around the 5th century, August 15 became one of the most important holidays on the Catholic calendar: the **Assumption of the Virgin Mary**. During the Renaissance, the Catholic Church wanted to make the secular August holiday fall on a religious feast day, so *ferragosto* was moved to August 15 to celebrate the Assumption of the Virgin Mary.

The importance of the Festival has been dedicated to the importance of family and community as we celebrate Italian heritage and culture."


