NATIONAL CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS ASSOCIATION CEREMONY

The Italian Heritage Lodge (IHL) of Fairfax, Virginia, #2517 of the Order Sons & Daughters of Italy in America, participated in the National Christopher Columbus Association (NCCA) Ceremony honoring the accomplishments of Christopher Columbus on Columbus Day, Monday, October 11, 2021. The annual event, in collaboration with the National Park Service, was held at the Columbus Memorial in front of the Union Station in Washington, D.C.

Members of the public in attendance were treated to patriotic music, the national anthems of the United States, Italy, and Spain, remarks by various diplomats and dignitaries, as well as the reading of the winning essay and presentation of awards to Joseph Stetson, Steubenville, Ohio, this year's winner of the NCCA and the National Italian-American Foundation Essay Contest on Christopher Columbus. Together with many other prominent organizations, the IHL placed a wreath in front of the Columbus Memorial.

After the ceremony, Dawn Falsinotti, IHL President, was presented with a Certificate of Membership in the NCCA "for the purpose of recognizing the historic achievements and discoveries of Christopher Columbus" by James P. McCusker, NCCA President

OSDIA "NATIONAL LEADERSHP GRANTS"

Through the Sons of Italy Foundation (SIF), and hundreds of thousands of family members located in all fifty states and the District of Columbia, the Order Sons and Daughters of Italy in America (OSDIA) has awarded nearly \$61 million in scholarships to date. In past years, the SIF has offered 10 to 15 merit-based scholarships (National Leadership Grants), ranging from \$4,000 to \$25,000, in a nationwide competition. Last year, students received a total of \$85,000 in merit-based scholarships!

General Information

<u>General Eligibility:</u> U.S. citizens of Italian descent (at least one Italian or Italian-American grandparent) enrolled in a four year undergraduate program or a graduate program at an accredited academic institution for the Fall 2022 term. Previous SIF scholarship winners are not eligible. Additional eligibility requirements may apply to specific scholarships.

<u>General Requirements:</u> Please see each scholarship description for its specific requirements. The following general requirements apply to all scholarships (except where noted):

- Application Form: Must be submitted along with requirements for each scholarship.
- Transcripts: For each scholarship, transcripts provided must be through the December 2021 term. All transcripts must be stamped by the institution.
- Processing Fee: A \$35 non-refundable processing fee is required with each scholarship application.

 The fee includes a one-year At-Large Membership to OSDIA, with all At-Large Membership benefits.

<u>Deadline:</u> The deadline for all scholarships (unless otherwise noted) is February 28, 2022. All requirements for a given scholarship must be met or the application will not be considered. All scholarship materials must be submitted online, and completed applications must be submitted by February 28, 2022. <u>No exceptions will be made. The SIF takes no responsibility for incomplete or late applications.</u>

<u>Process:</u> Applications are screened by education professionals. Final selection is made by OSDIA's National Scholarship, Education and Culture Committee. Scholarship recipients will be notified by May 1, 2022. Monetary awards are presented directly to the students' academic institutions in accordance with eligibility requirements.



This area is famous for marble and the entire marble industry. Massa Carrara is one town away and is where Michelangelo went to pick the pieces he would turn into masterpieces. It is also famous for sculpture; because of the marble, with many schools of sculpture. Francesco spent his childhood living in a convent with nuns. Post WWII it was not uncommon for parents to board their children at the local convent while they worked. While Francesco was treated well at the convent, it was not a pleasant environment for many of the kids. A lot of abuse committed by the nuns. At 14 he moved back home with his parents and began working as well as attending school. He began a career in marble and developed his skill and proficiency. Ricetta per la ribollita

La ribollita è un tipico piatto toscano, che ha le sue origini nel lontano Medioevo. Dopo il loro ricco pranzo, infatti, i nobili davano il pane avanzato ai servi, che lo univano alle loro povere verdure (patate, cavolo, piselli, zucchine, fagioli) e lo facevano bollire, ottenendo una zuppa saporita. Possiamo dire che questa zuppa è la "nonna" della ribollita! Ancora oggi questa ricetta fa parte della cucina casalinga in tutta la Toscana.



Ingredienti per 4 persone:

Parsley and onion to make the mixture 300 grams of black cabbage 1 savoy cabbage 400 grams of carrots 500 grams of potatoes 1 small celery 200 grams of peas 4/5 zucchine 500 grams of white beans Half a jar of tomato puree 500 grams of bread

Preparazione:

The first step is to cut the parsley and onion into small pieces and put them in the oil. After a few minutes, add the vegetables: start with the kale and the savoy cabbage. Once the kale and cabbage begin to cook, add half a jar of tomato puree to the pot. Then the carrots, and then the celery, potatoes, zucchini and peas. Finally, the white beans, which should be cooked alone, and now can be added to the other ingredients.

When the soup is cooked (at least an hour to be calculated) the bread is cut (traditionally it is old bread) and a layer of bread and a layer of vegetables are placed in a bowl, so several layers. Everything must rest at least 30 minutes.

Ribollita is a typical Tuscan dish, which has its origins in the distant Middle Ages. After their rich lunch, in fact, the nobles gave the leftover bread to the servants, who combined it with their poor vegetables (potatoes, cabbage, peas, courgettes, beans) and boiled it, obtaining a tasty soup. We can say that this soup is the "grandmother" of ribollita. Even today this recipe is part of home cooking throughout Tuscany.
