BASEBALL ITALIAN STYLE

Lawrence Baldassaro is a professor emeritus of Italian at the University of Wisconsin in Milwaukee. Starting in 1993 with Phil Rizzuto, he began a series of personal interviews which he recorded with 44 Italian-American Major Leaguers. Eight of them are in the Hall of Fame.

He conducted the last interview in 2017 with Anthony Rizzo and published this book in early 2018. The oldest players started their careers in the 1930s. Some of the interviewees who started their careers after 2000 are still playing. Because I did not become interested in baseball until 1954 when I was a kid, I had never heard of some of the players from the 1930s and the 1940s. If you read this book and if you are older than me, then you might have heard of all of the interviewees. Although he was not the first person to be interviewed by the author, the first interview appearing in the book is conducted with Frank Crosetti who I had heard of as a kid.

However, because I served on the local, state and national levels of the Commission for Social Justice, I noticed that all of the players from the 1930s and 1940s were the subjects of ethnic slurs. The slurs began to taper off from 1950 to 2000. After 2000, fortunately, none of the players who started their careers in this century stated that they were the objects of derogatory remarks because of their Italian ancestry. For example, Joe DiMaggio was called "the big dago": Yogi Berra, "ape"; Rico Petrocelli, "guinea"; and Larry Bowa, "wop".


Besides players, the interviewees include front-office executives, managers, coaches, and umpires. Interestingly, the author does not focus on statistical data but rather on their personal stories, always beginning with their family roots in Italy. Since my father was an immigrant from the region of Abruzzo, I was surprised by the number of interviewees who claimed roots on either their father's or their mother's side from this region. There were 44 fathers and 44 mothers, for a total of 88 parents. If you read this book, I am sure that you too will note the number of interviewees from your own family's home region.

The book is relatively short at 293 pages, including a two-page Table of Contents, a three-page Preface, a six-page Introduction, and a one-page Appendix at the end listing the 25 interviewees who are in the National Italian-American Sports Hall of Fame. Each interview covers from two to eleven pages, so the book is easy to read. The book is broken into nine chapters, each one covering a decade starting with the 1930s and ending with the current decade of the 2010s.

Moreover, you do not need to be an Italian American to enjoy these oral histories. The author records the dreams of the interviewees' parents as immigrants and their hopes for their children. No hopes included baseball. It was interesting to note that none of the interviewees were born in Italy, but they all knew the stories of their family experiences, some more than others. Every interview includes a black-and-white photo of the interviewee during his heyday, as I remember them. There are no photos of them now as old men when most of them were interviewed.

After finishing the book, I was so excited about what I had just read that I volunteered to write this one-page summary in the hope that other Italian-American baseball fans will read it too.
